Rating GR Members in 2024 By Art Politano, Rating Chair, Rating Committee

The goal of the rating process is to quantify the skill level of players and for them to enjoy competitive and/or social play. Section 13, Article IV of the GR Constitution and ByLaws covers the Rating Committee, the instrument for accomplishing this goal. Current Golden Racquets (GR) members are periodically reviewed and rated, as are new members. A brief overview of the rating process as it will be applied in the 2024 Calendar Year follows.

Scheduled Rating Review for Current Members:

In January 2024, all current members who were last rated in Calendar Year (CY) 2021 are due for an assessment. In January, the names of all these select current members will be

forwarded to the Rating Committee members and Captains to recommend a disposition of their ratings. There are about 85 of 381 current members needing a review, including players at all levels from 3.5 to 4.2.(four 3.5s, ten 3.6s, fourteen 3.7s, twenty-five 3.8s, twenty-four 3.9s, six, 4.0s, and two 4.2s.) Typically, recommendations for rating changes are based on a pattern of performance level over six months or so, rather than any one or two day short term performance.

Details along tennis skill areas are requested, so it is a detailed assessment of skill, not a simple judgement call. After the recommendations are made, there is a vote on the reasonableness of the recommendations. If there is a plurality of two votes for or against the change, then that recommendation carries. Usually, the great majority of players stay at their level. It is important. to point out that even if a select player is assessed a down rating that player can appeal, and can request and get an actual physical review of their performance.

So, if you were last rated in CY 2021, this is the time to speak to your venue captain or Rating Committee Member about your performance so that communication lines are open. In the Spring of 2024, Golden Racquets opens the organization to new members.

Rating Reviews of New Members:

Obviously, new members would have to be rated so that they can play at a commensurate level of their skill. To make an assessment of a new player's skill level a two step process is used. The first step is to have each player self-assess their skill level. This is done using a worksheet covering ten tennis skill areas derived from the USTA standards, including: serving, use of forehand, backhand, returns, net approach, court mobility net play of volleys, overhead, lob, and communication. There follows an on-court session of play and assessment using Rating Committee members who play at the expected level as the new player. Rating Committee members then assess the player on the same ten skill areas, as exhibited, ranging from poor to excellent. Rating Committee members share their observations of the new player's skill level in discussion among themselves and arrive at a consensus rating level for the player. This resulting rating will then qualify a new player to sign-up for a venue at that rating level or lower. After playing at a particular venue for a couple of months, the new players may find that their performance is better or worse than other players. At this point, the new players may ask to be rerated.

I hope I have given you some sense of how rating in CY 2024 will proceed. If you have questions, contact me at "gr8chair@gmail.com." Rating Committee Members and I are very much committed to be objective, and fair, and compassionate as we do our work. Substituting By Fred King, League Captain

We all joined Golden Racquets because of our love of playing tennis. However, it is very unlikely that everyone will be able to play every day of their scheduled playing time. Injuries, vacations, family events, and other activities mean that we sometimes must find a substitute to play for us. For other members, playing full-time is not possible because of travel or other commitments. However, when these players find a venue at a time and place at which they would like to play from time to time, they can sign up to be substitutes. Before the season begins, we have a sign up. during which those who wish to be regular players can so indicate, and those who wish to be substitutes at a venue can so indicate. It should be noted that when signing up the venues will give not only the dates and time of play, but there is also an indication of the sub fee, i.e. the amount that a substitute should pay to the regular player whom they are replacing.

When a regular player knows that he cannot play, it is their responsibility to find a sub. Their first place to look is the sub list that they receive at the beginning of the season. Only if they cannot find anyone from this list, should they look for other Golden Racquets members eligible to play at the venue. Only if they continue to have difficulty finding a sub, should they ask their captain for assistance. Once a sub is found, a player should notify their captain right away. It is the sub's responsibility to pay the sub fee to the player they are replacing.

I see this as a symbiotic relationship where both the regular player and the substitute benefit. Occasionally there are people who hope to sub without paying the sub fee. To me this is more of a parasitic relationship where the sub gets an opportunity to play and yet doesn't pay what they should for this opportunity. This is like trying to sneak into a show for free without paying the admission fee. Of course sometimes emergencies crop up with short notice and then it is appropriate for the sub to play without having to pay a fee. This is especially the case when the regular player cannot find a last-minute sub, and it falls on the captain to do so.

I notice that some players never ask subs to pay a fee. While this may make them feel like they are "nice guys", it actually can make it harder for those who ask for an appropriate fee to find a substitute. I also notice that some subs go out of their way to pay a fee, even if the regular player has not asked for it or has even said it is not necessary. Notes From the Treasurer By Al McFarland

The current Golden Racquets bank balance is about \$6,000, which is our targeted balance. All court fee payments to the indoor clubs have been made and all balls purchased for the winter season. Expenses for the additional pickleball venue starting in January, and the New Year's Day party will be covered by the member fees for those events.

As you know, we established a Zelle account with our bank and, for the first time this fall, allowed members to pay their signup fees via Zelle. 39 members successfully paid using Zelle. There were 7 individual payments of over \$1,000. Members used the Zelle capability from 11 different banks. From the treasurer's point of view, this was a successful new method of receiving payments. However, there were perhaps 8 to 10 members who told me they tried to pay with Zelle, but in the end, were unable to do so. We will continue to offer the option to pay with Zelle for all future payments. The Zelle payment is shown on our bank statement, with only the first and last name of the person making the payment.

If you are paying from the account of a person with a last name different from the name of the member, please let us know in advance. Because there may be quite a few different bank apps, all potentially with different procedures and limits, I cannot help members diagnose their problems. But I would ask that any who have difficulty let me know about which bank they are using, the experience they have, and any steps that solved the problem. I would like to include any tips that might be helpful in the Zelle instructions for future signups. I have included here a copy of the letter sent to the Fairfax County Park Foundation with the check for the member donations from 2023. For the last few years, we have included some words encouraging the Fairfax County Park Authority to consider providing indoor tennis and pickleball facilities. You may be interested in the historical increase in indoor court fees noted in this letter, especially since we are apparently not going to have indoor courts with the Arlington YMCA after 2024.

Golden Racquets Tennis and Pickleball Club is a club for persons over 50 in the Fairfax County area. As 92% of our members are 65 years or older, we clearly represent active seniors of our community. We have 358 members who play doubles tennis and pickleball at both indoor and

outdoor venues, including at several Fairfax County Parks. Throughout the year, members make voluntary contributions to our treasury that are designated for the Fairfax County Parks.

Included in this letter is a check to the Fairfax County Park Foundation for \$1,270.00 in appreciation for the opportunity to play at the county parks, and to support the continuation of tennis and pickleball activities. Some of our members, who play at the county parks during the summer, now find the cost excessive to play indoors at private clubs during the winter. In 2015 we paid \$22 per hour at two clubs, and \$24 per hour at a third, for winter season court time. Since then, one of the clubs has closed and the costs at the two remaining clubs were \$36 and \$45 per hour in 2023. The large increases reflect the increased demand from population growth, and the reduction in available indoor courts. Our club would like to encourage the Park Authority to provide indoor tennis and pickleball facilities at county parks. We would be happy to explain how our club operates and how we could contribute to the high utilization of such facilities.
